NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Derbyshire County Council (Public Footpath No. 24, Swadlincote) Public Path Diversion Order 1983

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 3rd March 1983, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Derbyshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert part of Footpath No. 24 to allow operation of the former clay and coal workings to be completed at the site off Hill Street, Swadlincote, and create a new line of path (as more particularly described below). The diversion will be of a temporary nature and for a period not exceeding 5 years.

*Description of site of existing footpath
Section and Position as indicated on map*

B—A. Part of Public Footpath No. 24 in Swadlincote commencing at point B (GR 3041 1965) and proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction to point A (GR 3075 1932) a distance of 454 metres or thereabouts.

Description of site of alternative highway

A—C. Commencing at the aforesaid point A and proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction to point C (GR 3057 1924) on Hill Street, Swadlincote, a distance of 215 metres or thereabouts.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the County Offices, Matlock (Room 109), between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays, and at the offices of the South Derbyshire District Council, Council Offices Swadlincote (Administration Department), during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned not later than 6th April 1983, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Derbyshire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Derbyshire County Council (Low Mine, Bonsall) Public Path Temporary Diversion Order 1983

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 3rd March 1983, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed

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by the Derbyshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way until 26th May 1985 (more particularly described below) to permit opencast mineral extraction at Low Mine, Bonsall, to take place in accordance with planning consent granted and create an alternative line of footpath (more particularly described below).

Existing Footpath to be Diverted

Section and Position as indicated on map in Order

A—B. That length of public footpath provided by the stopping-up of Highways (County of Derby) (No. 9) Order 1960 commencing at Point A (GR 2812 5861) and proceeding in an easterly thence south-easterly direction to Point B (GR 2821 5857) a distance of 90 metres or thereabouts.

B—C. That length of public footpath No. 72, Matlock Ward of the former Matlock Urban District commencing at the aforesaid point B and proceeding in a north-easterly direction to point C (GR 2825 5861) a distance of 60 metres or thereabouts.

Alternative Footpath

A—C. Commencing at the aforesaid point A and proceeding in an easterly direction to the aforesaid Point C a distance of 130 metres or thereabouts.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at Room 109, County Offices, Matlock, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the County Council, County Offices, Matlock, not later than Wednesday, 6th April 1983, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Derbyshire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
